| Executive Branch | PRESIDENT <br> Head of State; serves for four years | EUROPEAN COUNCIL <br> Heads of State or of Government; each member state has a sixmonth presidency of the Council |
|  | CABINET <br> Heads of executive departments appointed by the President and confirmed by the Senate to provide advice to the President in specific areas; cabinet members do not play a formal role in the legislative process | COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION <br> Made up of Ministers from each member state to enact laws; membership changes according to the issue under discussion; if there is a unanimous agreement, the Council can alter the Commission legislative proposals <br> EUROPEAN COMMISSION <br> Members; proposes legislation; monitors compliance with European Union rules; manages the budget |
| Legislative Branch | CONGRESS <br> House of Representatives (435 members) and Senate (100 members); legislation may originate in House; system of checks and balances applies | EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT <br> Members; cannot enact laws but can veto legislation in certain policy areas |
| Judicial Branch | SUPREME COURT <br> 9 justices serve for life; resolves disputes involving Constitutional issues | COURT OF JUSTICE <br> Judges serve 6-year terms; monitor compliance with European Union policies |
